SPRING BUSINESS MEETING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Spring Business Meeting will be held in the Heritage Room on **Sunday, May 26, 2013** immediately following the morning service. At this meeting, in accordance with the budget adopted by the Church on March 10, 2013, a motion will be presented to authorize the use of a further \$75,000 to be transferred from the Endowment Fund to the General Funds to cover the anticipated \$150,000 deficit of the Church in 2013.

Also, in accordance with the Budget, the Members will be asked to authorize the Trustees to reimburse the General Funds of the Church \$6000 for webcasting record backup and \$13000 for Sanctuary audio console control improvements.
