Last Sunday, Dr. Peter Holmes commenced a new Sunday morning sermon series entitled God at the Table. The series examines a number of Biblical texts pertaining to meals. The sermons consider everything from manna in the wilderness to the celebration of the Lord's Supper in the early church. Along the way the lessons will often be read in the service by lay people involved in various food ministries. On Wednesday evenings beginning on September 25 at 7pm, the ministry team and others will lead a weekly Bible Study in the Friendship Room based on the texts, (meals), for the Sunday to come. The Bible Study Series is called, Table Talk. The series will conclude with an audio video presentation by Tom Hayes on Wednesday, December 4 at 7:30 p.m. entitled The Art of the Meal featuring an exploration of some of the great masters' renditions in art of Biblical meals. If this appeals to your appetite you are welcome to take in as many or as few of the meals as you are able.


