



An Update on 2014 Offerings

This chart shows, in weekly increments from September 28th, the progress toward accomplishing the level of general offerings and contributions needed in 2014 to meet the Budget (leaving a deficit of \$55,455) or better still, to break even. Last year we were able to break even. Similarly generous commitments are needed again in 2014.

As of Nov 23, the general offerings yearto-date were 74% of the amount needed for the church to break even for the year.

The table above shows our expense and revenue position to the end of October. The offerings numbers in the graph are more up to date. The table shows that the overall offerings are pretty close to budget and to last year. The expenses are slightly higher than last year but below budget. Our deficit up to the end of October seems quite large at \$178,000. It is actually a bit less than we expected at this time of year. As of the end of October we need \$395,000 in offerings to match the budget and \$452,000 to break even. To get this much, will require more than the normal offerings. It is hoped that all supporters of YPBC will look into ways that this goal can be achieved.


