First Look (Preschool and Kindergarten) – The monthly theme for May is "I can help others." and the memory verse is: "Be kind and loving to each other." Ephesians 4:32, NCV. The Bible story this week is from 2 Kings 4:8-17 - A woman helps Elisha by building a room for him to sleep in when he needs a place to stay.



252Basics (Grades 1 to 5) – The monthly theme is "Honesty -2 Choosing to be truthful in whatever you say and do". The memory verse is, "Keep me from cheating and telling lies. Be kind and teach me your law." (Psalm 119:29 NIrV) This week's lesson is about Elisha's servant, Gehazi's lies taken from 2 Kings 5. The bottom line we want children to grasp is "When you are not truthful, you lose trust".
