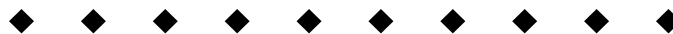

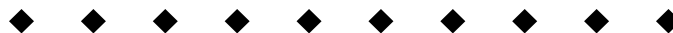

An Evening with Rosemary Aubert

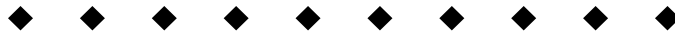
Yes! There is a new mystery in Rosemary Aubert's wonderful Ellis Portal series.
